



GMPA Safety Procedures for Summer Camp 2020

CAMPER EXPERIENCE:

- All students will move through a Welcome Routine when they show up for camp- which includes handwashing and a touchless temperature check.
- **Space:** Students will have their own designated area for: item storage, dancing, snacking and crafting.
- **Masks:** Students are encouraged to wear a mask in all scenarios except when eating and playing/exercising outdoors (as long as social distancing is taking place).
- **Hand Hygiene:** Students will wash hands in the following scenarios:
 - Arrival to the facility
 - Before and after eating or handling food
 - After using the bathroom
 - After playing outdoors
 - At the end of camp
 - As needed

GMPA SUPPORT:

- GMPA Staff will be wearing a mask at all times.
- GMPA will have a designated staff member responsible for health and safety present for each camp in addition to the camp instructor.
 - This person will be responsible for facilitating health safety procedures, including temperature checks and handwashing support.
 - This person will be responsible for implementing a variety of cleaning procedures throughout the day- which includes disinfecting frequently touched areas and common spaces.
- Our studio has been equipped with an air purifier featuring true HEPA filter with aerasafe antimicrobial treatment and carbon filter for four-stage filtration process that captures 99.97% of airborne particles.
- We will be splitting our time between indoor and outdoor activities.
- GMPA staff will do a complete cleaning of the space between camp groups and again prior to the start of evening classes.
- GMPA staff will be structuring activities with social distancing protocols in mind. They will offer students prompts and support to help them stay safe while having fun.

This list is not exhaustive but meant to give you a big picture view of our work to take care of our campers. We will be adhering to all Vermont Health Dept and CDC recommendations, protocols and procedures.
